Fresh off the press:

WCH Australia has completed a successful month-long webinar series with an international audience highlighting many different aspects of health and wellbeing with experts from Australia and abroad to support health sovereignty for all.

WCH Brazil continues with its wide-reaching popular campaign to remove the Covid-vaccinations from the childhood schedule and protect Brazilian children. This campaign has now been running for over a month and is moving from state auditorium to state auditorium for parents to come and seek information and redress. Although 'just' removing these gene-altering injections from the childhood schedule may not seem like enough to some, activists and concerned medical professionals have started what looks to be an ongoing campaign that will extend its reach with time. WCH Japan Coalition has currently disbanded due to various technicalities, including the official resignation of Dr Tess Lawrie as director last December, and the resignation of members of the steering committee, causing the organisation to not be currently practicable. (Although Dr Lawrie's name still appears on the website, she did resign seven months ago and still awaits the amendment of the website and other). We await new representation from the honourable people of Japan, who number in the many thousands supporting the Better Way Principles and grassroots movement for health sovereignty and wellbeing.
